PARENT REQUESTS FOR 2014-2015

Dufferin Elementary School will not be sending out parent request forms this year for placement in 2014-2015. The school undergoes a rigorous process when considering the placement of students.

If there is information that the school does not have and should consider when placing your child, you can write a letter or send an email to (mbowden@sd73.bc.ca) by June 13, 2014. In your letter please describe the learning environment that may suit your child's needs. If you are requesting placements that involve other students, think carefully and provide an explanation. The information you provide will be shared with staff as part of the placement process. Please be aware that late requests. including requests in September, may not be considered.

Please note that no letters will be accepted if names of staff members are used. Letters containing staff names will not be used in the class building process. All staff at Dufferin Elementary are certified and qualified teachers. Our goal is to meet the needs of ALL students and maximize the growth as learners as a whole community. We appreciate your support in this complex multi-level process of arranging educationally sound and balanced classes.

TICKS ARE BACK!

Warm spring weather brings out ticks, small bugs that bite and feed on the blood of humans and animals and can sometimes transmit disease. Ticks are most often found in tall grass and wooded areas, including playground areas. Fortunately there are precautions people can take and ways to deal with them.

One of the most important ways to reduce the risk is to do a daily skin check on your children. If you find a tick, wear

gloves and gently remove it. Be careful not to crush the tick as this could cause it to inject its stomach contents in to the skin. If you find a tick, check very carefully for

others. Other tips to remove ticks safely include:


- Use needle-nose tweezers to gently grasp the tick close to the skin.
- Without squeezing, pull the tick straight out.
- After removal, clean the area with soap and water.

BIKES / SCOOTERS / SKATEBOARDS

Now that the snow is gone, many students are bringing their bikes, scooters and skateboards to school. Unfortunately, this also causes some

safety concerns. For the time being, students can use them for transportation before and after school, but during morning, recess and lunch they will need to be put away. Our play area is limited and used for basketball, four square and



skipping. Riding skateboards and scooters presents a hazard during these busy times and the school does not have a designated area for this activity.

When students are using their bikes, scooters, or skateboards before and after school, they MUST be wearing a helmet at all times.

AFTER SCHOOL

With better outside weather, students have been bringing a number of personal items to school to use during breaks. Although we like to encourage students to keep busy, we also would like to remind parents that the school is not responsible for any personal items brought to school by students. This includes items such as Pokeman or other trading cards. The school can not provide a secure environment for these items.

If you or your child chooses to bring these items to school it is at your own risk. If they do, they are to be used appropriately. Trading, buying and selling personal items are not allowed during school time.

TRACK AND FIELD


The school is participating in the zone and district track meets in the next two weeks. If your child is
