A regular and predictable bed time also builds in those healthy routines!

HALLOWEEN TIPS



Halloween is just over a week away, so it's time to start thinking about ensuring this will be a safe night for you and your children. There are many tips online to review before the big day, including:

- Be visible – use flashlights, glow sticks or reflective material
- Stay in a group – Be in a group with an adult supervisor. This is the best way to stay safe and avoid potential predators.
- Review Stranger Safety – never go with a

stranger or enter a strange home.

- Check treats before consuming them – have an adult check the treats to make sure they are safe to consume or that they do not have allergy triggers.
- Review traffic safety

A friendly reminder to parents that Halloween falls on a Thursday, so there will still be school the next day. Please ensure your children have adequate sleep and moderate their sugar intake so they will have a successful day at school. Also if you do send treats to school, remember we have a number of staff and students who have serious allergies. Please make sure you try and avoid sending treats that may contain nut ingredients.

DUFFERIN ROCKS!

At Dufferin Elementary we follow our ROCKS matrix. ROCKS stands for:

R *espectful*

O *n time and prepared*

C *areful*

K *ind*

S *elf-disciplined*

Some of the more recent things we have been working on are:

1. Hands and Feet to self – especially during breaks. Rough housing often leads to children getting hurt (mostly unintentional) and angry reactions.
2. Appropriate Language – encouraging students to use appropriate language, especially during breaks.
3. Coming into the school right when the bell goes and being prepared to participate in class. As we move into the year, some students are slower to return to their classes after the bell.

If you could review these expectations with your children at home it would help us maintain a positive school culture at Dufferin.
