### **SCHOOL PARKING**

For the safety of our students and to avoid congestion, we would like to remind parents that parking/dropping off students in the ROUND-ABOUT AREA in front of the school is **restricted to buses and daycare only.**

We have four buses that bring students to school and pick up after school as well as bus pick up for field trips. It is important that the roundabout area is accessible for buses at all times. We have had several incidents where buses could not access the round about for loading during school field trips due to vehicles stopped in “no parking” zones. Please model respect and obey the traffic signs. **Also be aware that these are city by-law regulations, and by-law officers will be monitoring and ticketing offenders.**

### **BASKETBALL SEASON**

The Basketball season is ready to begin this year. League play will start beginning the week of January 19 and ending the week of February 19. Playoffs will follow. Tier 1 boys (grade 6/7) will play on Tuesdays and girls (grade 6/7) on Thursdays. Tier 3 (grade 4/5) boys and girls will play on Wednesdays.

## CELL PHONES

The school district has a policy (Policy 406.1) concerning the use of cell phones at school. Please be advised that should you require your child(ren) to have a cell phone at school, you and your child are required to be aware of our guidelines concerning the use of cell phones.



Students can not use cell phones or electronic devices during instructional times unless explicitly directed by the teacher. They are also required to use devices appropriately at all times, which includes respecting others rights to privacy by not taking pictures or videos without permission from an adult from the school. A violation of this policy will result in confiscation of the electronic device.

## HEAD LICE

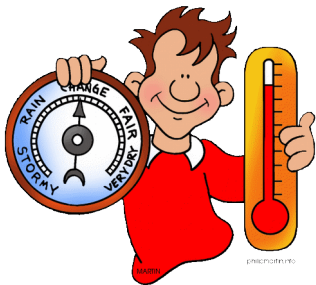
With the colder weather and holidays, students are 'bundling' up, wearing hats, keeping inside and in close contact with friends and family. This makes it easier for our pesky friends the head lice to spread.

It is recommended to parents that you **check your children at home at least once a week!** If you find any, please treat them immediately and report it to the school so that we can take steps to keep them under control. The school handles any reported cases confidentially.

### **More information about head lice and how to control them can be found on our school website.**

Thank you in advance for helping with this. Vigilance by the home is the best way to control the spread of head lice. Remember, it isn't enough to just use the shampoo. Some lice are immune - so removal of all the nits (eggs) from the hair after treatment is necessary or they can hatch and re-infest. It only takes one live louse to lay hundreds of eggs.

## DRESSING FOR THE WEATHER



Please make sure your children are dressed appropriately. The weather can change drastically during the day. This also affects our footwear. Students should have separate inside and outside

footwear. When entrances are marked by orange cones, this is an indicator that students should be removing their outside footwear at the door to keep our hallways and classroom clean. A reminder students are expected to be outside during breaks unless the temperature is **colder than -15 Celsius**. Please have your children dress accordingly.

## FOUNDATION SKILLS ASSESSMENT (FSA)

It is that time of year again for students in grades 4 and 7 to write the provincial Foundation Skills Assessment (FSA). This is a province wide assessment for students based on provincial learning outcomes in Reading, Writing and

Numeracy. Grades four, seven, and ten students in the school district will be writing the FSA between **January 19th and February 13th, 2015**.

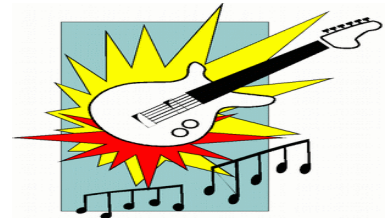
**All students in grades 4 and 7 in attendance during those dates are required to write this assessment.** Please be aware that according to the School Act in B.C. - parents, teachers, or **principals CAN NOT excuse students** from writing the assessment unless they are on a modified special education program, or have a **diagnosed** medical disability that prevents them from writing.

## DUFFERIN ROCKS!

At Dufferin Elementary we follow our ROCKS matrix. ROCKS stands for:

R **espectful**  
O **rganized**  
C **aring**  
K **ind**  
S **afe**



This month we are going to be working on **Safety!** Being safe means you act in a way that shows you are being safe at all times and care about others safety.

We will also be working on strategies to deal with peer conflicts (TILT):

T = Talk to the person  
I = Ignore  
L = Leave  
T = Tell an adult

If you could review these expectations as well as the parent/student handbook with your children at home it would help us maintain a positive school culture at Dufferin. A copy of the ROCKS Matrix can also be found in the student agenda.

Some of the SNOW SAFETY rules are listed below, please review them at home with your child.

### **Sliding**

- Slide in designated areas only
- Soft sleds only
- Feet first
- Make sure the hill is clear BEFORE sliding down
- Move off hill (bottom of hill) as soon as you come to a stop
- No horseplay



### **Snow Rules**

- Snow stays ON THE GROUND
- Snow is for building and sliding – Respect what others have built (look after it if you are using it and ONLY break things that you alone have built).
